

## Educational visits typically taken in the Reception Year

Name of trip	Links to the curriculum	Purpose	Estimate of cost
Chertsey Museum 	Understanding the world; people, communities and technology.	A half day visit, the Reception children visit Chertsey Museum to explore old and new toys. Through a range of interactive activities the children can make comparisons between then and now and suggest reasons for differences.	£12

Name of trip	Links to the curriculum	Purpose	Estimate of cost
Alice Holt Woodland Park 	Understanding the world.	This visit is used to support the work in school on the topic of mini-beasts. The visit gives the children the opportunity to search for mini-beasts and classify them. On a woodland walk, they use their senses to think carefully about their surroundings and where the mini-beasts might be living.	£19

Name of trip	Links to the curriculum	Purpose	Estimate of cost
West Wittering Beach 	Understanding the world.  Physical development; moving and handling.  Personal, social and emotional development; self-confidence and self-awareness.	Used to support the topic of 'Journeys' that the children will have been studying over the summer term. The trip to the beach is the realisation of the journey they have been planning for some weeks. Whilst at the beach the children will engage in drawing, sports, a scavenger hunt, sandcastle- making and paddling in the sea.	£18


Name of trip	Links to the curriculum	Purpose	Estimate of cost

We will be welcomed by the Imam, who will tell us all about the history of the mosque and what it is like to be Muslim.  We will also take the time to look at the complex patterns and decoration of the building and make some sketches.	£15

Florence Nightingale Museum 	History	We visit Florence Nightingale Museum to discover what life was like for this famous nurse.  Our expert guide will explain her importance in history and help us discover what the world was like in the 1850s .	£20

Name of trip	Links to the curriculum	Purpose	Estimate of cost
Haslemere Museum 	History	This visit is used to consolidate the children's learning about Ancient Egyptians. The children will have the opportunity to explore exhibits showing what life was like in Ancient Egypt, as well as seeing some genuine Egyptian artefacts.	£14

Name of trip	Links to the curriculum	Purpose	Estimate of cost
Alice Holt Woodland Park 	Geography	The pupils will have the opportunity to use their mapping skills to orienteer around the forest. They will also have the chance to look at habitats in more depth and make observations about why certain habitats are suited for certain animals.	£18

Name of trip	Links to the curriculum	Purpose	Estimate of cost
Look Out Discovery Centre 	Science	At the Look Out Discovery Centre, the children will have the opportunity to take part in an interactive and hands-on exhibition related to plants. The children will also learn about food chains as well as being able to explore the centre, particularly the 'light and shadow' exhibition.	£16

Name of trip	Links to the curriculum	Purpose	Estimate of cost
Butser Ancient Farm 	History	A day visit to the farm where the children have the opportunity to engage in such tasks as jewellery making, chalk carving, daubing/clunching, archaeology and have a tour of the villa.	£20

Name of trip	Links to the curriculum	Purpose	Estimate of cost
River Rythe 	Geography	As part of our geography unit on rivers, the children spend the morning carrying out field work activities around the River Rythe in Claygate. They learn about measuring flow rate as well as examining the cross section of the river and the plants and animals of the surrounding environment.	£3

Name of trip	Links to the curriculum	Purpose	Estimate of cost
Neasden Temple 	R.E	We visit the Hindu temple at Neasden during the school's R.E. focus week on Hinduism. The children learn about the history of the temple and Hindu culture and observe a traditional meditation session at the heart of the Mandir, the Great Hall.	£3

Name of trip	Links to the curriculum	Purpose	Estimate of cost
Sayers Croft 	P.E, E.P.R, maths, geography, science	On our first residential trip, the children gain considerable benefits both educationally and personally. It provides them with the opportunity to shine in a way that may not be possible in the classroom environment. Climbing Pitch Hill, building rafts and shelters, orienteering and a camp fire complete with toasted marshmallows - the activities scheduled are a combination of a number of subjects which enable children to become more aware of their strengths and abilities, often leading to a tremendous boost in self-confidence and independence.	£160

Name of trip	Links to the curriculum	Purpose	Estimate of cost
Hampton Court 	History	Dressed in Tudor clothes, the children will consider the life of Henry VIII and his marriages. They will also learn about the lives of different types of people living in Tudor times. They will consider the characteristic features of society at a time in the distant past.	£11

Name of trip	Links to the curriculum	Purpose	Estimate of cost
Osmington Bay PGL Centre 	Geography, history, EPR, P.E.	On the children's second residential trip they will further develop their team working skills, independence and resilience. They will discuss the concept of short and long periods of time, in the context of rock and fossil formation, erosion and the immediate past. Pupils are encouraged to compare their local environment with Lulworth and any other places they have visited. Pupils will learn how the local landscape has changed and continues to evolve.	£250

Name of trip	Links to the curriculum	Purpose	Estimate of cost
Henley Fort 	History	An opportunity for children to experience life in World War II, this trip gives children the chance to learn about the Home Guard. The children will step inside two different air-raid shelters, practice their marching techniques, and understand what life was like with rationing, blackouts and air-raid drills.	£34

Name of trip	Links to the curriculum	Purpose	Estimate of cost
Guildford Museum 	History, English, maths.	The children will spend the whole day in a Victorian classroom, working with slate and chalk to experience a Victorian education. They will immerse themselves fully, dressing up in costume and participating in Victorian games.	£30

Name of trip	Links to the curriculum	Purpose	Estimate of cost
UK Sailing Academy 	P.E, E.P.R, geography	A 5-day, 4-night trip to the Isle of Wight, this residential allows children to grow as individuals, as they tackle a series of unfamiliar water-based tasks. Over the course of a week, the children will learn keel-boating, sailing, kayaking and a host of other water sports. They will understand the importance of team-work, but also grow as independent individuals, as they experience activities which strengthen and enhance their own skills.	£430
