Why St. Paul's doesn't 'do' Halloween

Halloween has become increasingly popular in recent years. How should we respond as Christians to that date in the 'secular' calendar? There's no need to regard Halloween celebrations as evil, nor to criticise those who do make a party out of it. But we should help our children to focus their reflections on the Christian faith that underlies (and undercuts) this modern pagan festival. After all, the name of the day is itself a contraction of 'All Hallows Eve' - in other words, the night before the Feast of All Saints.

Long before pumpkins were carved into masks in the New World, large root vegetables (swedes and manglewurzles) were being made into lanterns in England on October 31st to guard the graves of deceased loved ones - a sign of Easter Faith, the victory of the light of Christ over the darkness of sin and death.

Nut and Sesame Seed Allergies

Mrs. S. Thuilliez

As you are aware, the school is a nut-free zone as we have a number of pupils with life-threatening allergies to various nuts and sesame. The reaction can occur when an allergic child is exposed either by eating nuts or sesame seed or in the presence of others who have eaten nut/sesame products in their pure form, e.g. peanut butter/sesame seed bars, hummus or rolls with seeds on them. The school caterers already have the necessary checking procedures in place, but we do need the help of the parents who provide packed lunches and also for the weekly cake sales. Your co-operation in checking all packaging to ensure no products containing these ingredients are brought into school is very much appreciated.

Medical Needs: School Clubs

Parents of all children with special medical needs must inform the leaders of any after-school clubs that they attend. Those leaders will need to be in a position to deal with any medical emergency that may arise. The school office staff will assist if they are available but the leaders may need to contact the parents directly. We are pleased to start back this September with a new automatic secure gate system at the front of the school. We hope parents feel this improves the schools safety and would like to thank parents for the additional money to support our LCVAP bid to complete the works. Mr Skivington and Mr McGuire have been the driving force for the fund raising and we Thank them both for this.

Absence – Mrs. L. Pryor

The Education (Pupil Registration)(England) (Amendment) Regulations 2013, which became law on 1st September 2013 state that Headteachers may not grant any leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances. The Headteacher should determine the number of school days a child can be away from school if leave is granted. In accordance with the above Regulations, requests for leave of absence are treated sympathetically, but only in exceptional circumstances can they be approved. The government policy, to which this school abides, states that parents who take their child out of school for five days or more during term time, without the authority of the Headteacher, will each be liable to receive a penalty notice. Penalty notices will be issued by the Local Authority. The penalty is £60 if paid within 21 days of receipt of the notice, rising to £120 if paid after 21 days but within 28 days of receipt of the notice. If the penalty is not paid in full by the end of the 28-day period the Local Authority must prosecute the recipient for failing to ensure regular school attendance under section 444 of the Education Act 1996.

Please be aware that each parent is liable to receive a penalty notice for each child who incurs unauthorised absences, for example, if there are two parents and one child, each parent will receive one Penalty Notice. If there are two parents and two children incurring unauthorised absences, each parent will receive two penalty notices, which in this case would amount to £120 each.

The issue of a Penalty Notice will also be considered where attendance has fallen below 90% and there are no less than 10 unauthorised sessions (5 days) during the preceding 6 school weeks.

Absence figures are collated once a year and reported to parents on the spring term report. If a child is ill, it is the responsibility of the parents to ensure the school office receives a telephone message on the first day of absence from school. The school answerphone is on between 4.30pm and 8.30am for this purpose. In the event that the office has not received an explanation for a child's absence/lateness a member of staff will telephone the parents directly. This must be followed with a confirmation email when your child returns to class. If an email is not received on the day a child returns to school please note that the termly reports will indicate an unauthorised absence.

Lateness Figures – Mrs. L. Pryor

I am frequently impressed by the large number of children who are never late for class. I know how hard it is to be punctual when there is such a short time slot to travel to school.

To help identify if there is a problem, the class teacher will write to you on a termly basis, if your child has been late for class.

Attendance- Mrs. L. Pryor

As per the previous academic year, children will now receive a very special certificate for getting 100% attendance. These will be issued termly and for children achieving 100% for the full year, they will receive a badge and certificate. These certificates and badges will be given out in a celebratory assembly. Medical Information - Diarrhoea and Vomiting Mrs. S. Thuilliez

In accordance with Surrey County Council Guidelines the period for children to be kept from school is 48 hours after the last incident of diarrhoea or vomiting. Your co-operation with this requirement will help to stop any infection spreading in our school community.

School Nurse Service – Mrs. S. Thuilliez

Our pupils are supported by a school nursing service provided by Central Surrey Health, which is contracted by the NHS. The school nurses work as part of a wider 0-19 years Children and Families Service. These teams are committed to supporting the health, development and wellbeing of all those aged between 0-19 years. The 0-19 Team is comprised of specialist practitioner school nurses and health visitors, staff nurses, nursery nurses and clinical health assistants. Therapist such as speech and language therapists, occupational therapists and physiotherapists may also see children with specific needs.

The school nursing team provide:

- Health Screening
- Health Education as part of the school curriculum: for example, healthy life style choices
- Advice, support and referral to specialist services such as Speech and Language Therapy, Occupational Therapy and Physiotherapy
- School staff training on a range of medical issues e.g. use of Adrenaline Auto Injectors for children with allergies and asthma management
- Additional services for children and families with specific needs.

The school nursing team is also available to provide support to parents and carers on a range of health issues that may be concerning them, and where appropriate signpost to appropriate services. Further information including contact details can also be found on [CSH Surrey's website](#)

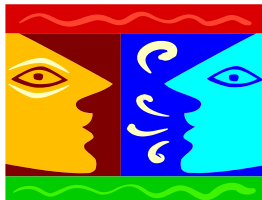
