Use of Pupil Premium

Background

The Pupil Premium is allocated to children from low-income families who are currently known to be eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) in both mainstream and non-mainstream settings and children who have been looked after continuously for more than six months. From September 2012 this has also included pupils eligible for FSM at any point in the last 6 years (known as the Ever 6 FSM measure).

Schools are free to spend the Pupil Premium as they see fit. However, we will be held accountable for how we use the additional funding to support pupils from low-income families. From September 2012, we have been required to publish online information about how we have used the extra Premium. This will ensure that parents and others are made fully aware of the attainment of pupils covered by the Premium and the extra support that they receive.

Our School

In 2016 – 2017 St Paul's Catholic Primary School will receive £7200 for Pupil Premium. **Other funding will be added to this to ensure that we can support all of our targeted pupils.**

In 2016 – 2017 the funding will be used for the following:

• Personalised Learning Groups led by teachers to support interventions in reading, writing and maths	£3079
• Half termly data meetings	£1800
• Mentoring support	£750
• Educational visits	£1224
• After-school clubs	£347

Planned outcomes to be evaluated in July 2017:

- For 100% of targeted children to meet the national attainment thresholds in reading, writing and maths.
- Reading and spelling ages to be in line with targeted children's chronological age.
- All targeted children to achieve age appropriate expectations on St Paul's Expectation and Continuity grid.
- End of year targets met by each individual.
- Access to afterschool clubs for all targeted pupils.
- Access to all residential and educational visits for all targeted pupils.

In 2015 – 2016 St Paul's Catholic Primary School received £7920 for Pupil Premium. **Other funding will be added to this to ensure that we can support all of our targeted pupils.**
