As such an absence taken as a choice brings with it a cost to the other children as their teacher is gap filling for a child whose parent chose to remove them, rather than working directly with the class.

### Year 2 trip to Florence Nightingale Museum -

They understood how the impact of her reforms has improved our hospitals today. Lunch was taken in the hospital with a view of the River Thames and The Houses of Parliament. ### Year 3 Trip to Haslemere - Miss. A. Adams and Miss. E. McDonald

On Tuesday 10th October year 3 visited the Haslemere Museum. We spent the day learning lots of new and exciting facts about the Ancient Egyptians and their beliefs about life after death. 
### Upcoming SPPA events for your diary
